Seminar 2022- LuLu Martin Report Stands

Seminar 2023 – Dr. Linda A. Walker no report provided so update was given by other members of EC committee. Currently 176 participants, 10 teachers, 10 classes (2 classes made and a lottery was used) Open registration is ongoing. Invoices went out to those who early registered.

Seminar 2024 – Joy Cobb Report Stands

It is becoming more important for committee members to have IT skills. Teachers have been contacted. 23 teachers submitted projects but no beaded projects were submitted. A mini class chairman is still needed.

Seminar 2025- Debra Bessent Report Stands

Hotel prices are challenging. With 80 people projected to attend it may be cost prohibited. The Municipal Convention Center in Hurst might be a possibility. This is the first seminar that has post Covid costs for a hotel..

2025 EGA National Seminar – Karen Dittmar

Karen Dittmar has resigned as chairman.

National is also struggling to find a hotel with a reasonable prices.

OLD BUSINESS

- 1. SCR Logo This has not been looked at
- 2. Website Security There has been several requests for a more secure website. It is being discussed to remove names and only have positions on the website for all to see.
- 3. Zoom Coordinator Position Gretchen and Valorie are working on zoom coordinator. It is frustrating that our zoom level does not have access to live customer support.
- 4. Chapter Officer Concerns Many small chapters only have enough members to rotate positions of leadership. Some of the smaller chapters also have unfilled positions. A discussion ensued about eliminating some leadership positions by changing the policies.

NEW BUSINESS

- Motion To allow the SCR Secretary to serve two terms.
 Rationale: 1. Exceptions have been made for both the SCR Treasurer and Education Chair positions to serve two consecutive two-year terms.
 2. It can take considerable time to gain expertise in the position's duties.
 3. The change may make it easier to find people to serve as the secretary. Motion was 2nd by Gretchen. It passed.

 The candidates will be sent out 30 days before the Feb. meeting
 An email Blast will also be sent out to all members.
- 3. Meeting Venue Concerns
 - Hotels and meals are very expensive. There is a possibility of 1 hotel in Grapevine that Valorie will check out. Our meeting could be at a restaurant. A discussion on best dates resulted in recommendation of Feb. 3rd and 4th. A suggestion for our EC meeting to be in a hotel suite. Another possible location is the Grapevine City Government building and to have meals delivered using Uber.

A question about a zoom meeting was discussed. Relationship building is valuable. A Comfort Inn is 8 miles away from Convention Center and could be a recommended hotel. There is more participation when meetings are face to face. A suggestion was to have both meetings on Saturday with a social time on Friday night. Melanie was asked about hotel reimbursement.

4. SCR 2024 Seminar Workplan

The committee is discussing how to handle virtual class fees. This may change due to the type of projects. A motion to accept workplan was made by Gretchen and 2nd by Shawn. Motion approved.

5. Social Media Coordinator

Gretchen is working on this position for Seminar 2024. Discussion about accounts that are generic for all seminars vs. accounts that are seminar specific. The pros and cons were brought forward. A motion was made to have Gretchen the Social Media Coordinator by Sherri and 2nd by Michelle. Motion carried.

NATIONAL BOARD REPORT

STATISTICS: As of January 6, 2023, SCR has 761 primary members and 101 MALs for a total of 862 members. That is an increase of 77 members since August report. Chapters are encouraged to reach out the MAL's in their area. There are 24 active chapters in the region. 3 chapters have satellites and 4 chapters have special interest groups such as Japanese beading, other beading, and samplers.

SEMINAR 2023: The EGA SCR 2023 Seminar "Sugar Land Express" will be held in Sugar Land, Texas, June 6-10, 2023, hosted by the Houston Embroidery Guild. 10 teachers have been selected with a wide variety of needlework techniques. Registration is open.

SEMINAR: The EGA SCR 2024 Seminar "Dive Into Stitching" will be held in San Marcos, Texas, June 12-15, hosted by the South Central Region. 7 teachers have been selected with a variety of needlework techniques. Registration will open at Seminar 2023 in Sugar Land.

EDUCATION: The EGA SCR 2025 Seminar will be hosted by the Fort Worth Chapter. Planning is underway. The EGA SCR 2026 Seminar will be hosted by the Greater Dallas Chapter. The EGA National Seminar will be hosted by the South Central Region. Joy Cobb has been approved as Chairman.

SCR offered 3 GCC courses this year. The region pays the registration fee and cost of shipping the finished piece(s) to and from the teacher. The student pays only their text fee plus shipping. A SCR sponsored zoom class by Debbie Rowley of DebBee's Designs. SCR underwrote the teaching fee for all students. You had to be a member of a chapter in the South Central Region. The class was well attended with 30 plus students.

ONLINE PRESENCE/COMMUNICATION: SCR has a website, www.egascr.org. along with 11 of our chapters. 14 chapters have a Facebook page. All chapters have either a periodic newsletter or communicate news and events via Group.io. STITCHES, the SCR bi-monthly publication is sent to all primary and plural members via email with email blasts as needed. SCR has a Zoom account that can be used for region meetings, seminar meetings, classes and lectures. Chapters are encouraged to take advantage of Zoom. It has been beneficial to out of town members for attending meetings, classes, and lectures.

MISCELLEANOUS: The five elected region officers hold regular monthly Zoom meetings that enable them to discuss current matters and insures we are in strategic agreement prior to the SCR board meetings.

The Seminar Mentor holds monthly Zoom meetings with all seminar chairmen and invites committee chairs when necessary. Chapters are encouraged to find new ways to reach out for new members and to market their chapters. Social Media and Outreach Programs have had a big influence on gaining new members.

All three classes offered in 2022 made and proceeded normally. I have heard of no issues this year. We had 47 total registrants this year, across three classes.

I have been concerned in the past, and again this year, about the offerings from the GCC program from National. All the programs are good, but I have offered most of what is available. The few I have not offered I have learned from experience (similar classes didn't make) that they are not of interest to our members.

There is also a lot more competition from online classes now and many of those classes are much easier to participate in.

Therefore, this year, the classes offered are all classics, 2 encores and a long time standard.

- 3. Desert Strands with Becky Autry, Russian drawn thread, Confident beginner to Intermediate, (\$35.00) https://egausa.org/courses/desert-strands/

One thing I tried to be very aware of this year is the price and availability of supplies, which heavily influenced my choices. I know we all have lots of things to finish after covid lock down stitching, whitework can be done in cotton or silk, and Desert Strands can be used as a stash buster!

It still takes just 5 registrants for the class to make, and the \$25.00 finishing incentive is still in place. However, we will no longer be able to add an additional class as we have in the past, other than the ones presented above.

These classes are offered as benefit of being a South Central Region member and is not open to out of region members unless they are a plural chapter/region member.

Please remember: Classes can only start once National has verified dues payment. Since that does not happen until mid-July or August, best possible starting date is early September. If you do not wish a check to be outstanding that long, just email me of your interest and I'll let you know if it makes. Don't forget, you can also sign up at Seminar. Therefore, please remind all members, but especially those interested in a GCC, to pay their dues promptly!
